

## Fusion Mornington Peninsula

Tonight more than 116,000 Australians are experiencing homelessness. 42% are under the age of 25. Fusion are the only youth housing (15 – 21) service on the Mornington Peninsula.

More than a shelter, Fusion's live-in mentor model creates a family environment; providing the stability and support to develop the life skills you would normally learn at home eg. Cooking, cleaning, budgeting etc. By providing early interventions for youth, we are addressing many issues that trigger long-term homelessness.

Fusion also deliver youth programs and camps addressing social issues and developing self confidence, leadership and resiliency,. One of their most transformative camps is the annual Pilgrimage to Uluru, helping young people to "know the past and change the future"

## Clare's story

*"We'd been homeless for a while, So Mum got into a relationship with this guy; it meant we had a house, but it was violent. I was thrown down stairs, pushed into walls, hit all the time. The night DHS took us, there had been a massive fight. I went upstairs to see what was happening; mum cut her throat with a knife and the boyfriend was there egging her on. I was 12 years old.*


*Initially I was placed with my older sister, but when that fell apart I looked for housing myself. I lived with different friends; sometimes on a couch, sometimes I had a bed. At one friend's house there was an older guy there. We had to have sex.*

*Sometimes I had no other option but to sleep in the park. That was hard. There were so many creepy guys that would walk past and see if I wanted to stay with them. I didn't have anywhere that was safe.*

*When I was told about Fusion, I didn't realise the chance I was being given! This is the best place I've ever lived. It's where I have felt the most safe and the most stable. Having rules was new, but I liked it .*

*I've encountered love here. I feel loved. Protected. Safe.*

*I can't believe people spend their time and money to create this place. That you would do that for me. I know I can stay here until we find a good next step together."*

## Zoe Child Rescue

Zoe Child Rescue prevent, rescue and restore the lives of child trafficking victims.

Based in Thailand, Zoe work alongside government and law enforcement to rescue children & shut down child trafficking operations.

When rescued, the children stay in safe houses and begin the long process of rehabilitation to get their lives back. This includes schooling, counselling, mentoring and vocational training.

## Mongolia Care

After the fall of Communism in Mongolia, inflation rose to 50% and the country faced high unemployment and poverty rates. Desperate people resort to crime and violence in order to help their families survive.

Mongolia Care provides training and support for prisoners. Those who demonstrate a life changing transformation during their work and life skills training program, are supported upon their release; able to access housing & income earning opportunities so they can start afresh. The Director was himself an ex-prisoner who experienced this kind of support and transformation, and is now a respected leader in Mongolia

## Ruel Foundation

The Ruel Foundation care for impoverished children in the Philippines. The team provide medical care, accommodation, education and surgeries for children with treatable medical conditions and physical deformities. Most of the children surgeries are for cleft lip and/or cleft palate, club feet or tumours.

32% of children in the Philippines are stunted due to malnourishment. Through their malnourishment program, hundred of babies have been nursed back to health from the verge of death and returned to their communities with support to maintain their nutrition.

## NUAN'S STORY

*"I grew up in a very poor family and we lived in the jungle. Growing up I remember that we really had a good family and we really loved each other and then something happened when my Mum passed away.*

*My brother went to work in the city, my sister was sold into prostitution and my Dad left me at a store. I became one of the maids, cleaning the house, cleaning the store. A lady came to the shop and she was a woman who sells the kids to be a prostitute which I didn't know back then.*

*The shopkeeper said do you want this girl? She was about to take me out of the store and then amazingly, I believe that it was because of God's plan and God's goodness for my life, another lady came in. Then they were fighting over who should have me. At the end the shopkeeper said let the girl pick. I don't know why but I chose the second lady."*

Unknown to Nuan the lady she chose was a local Christian and after a long journey Nuan finally made it to ZOE.

*"When I first came to Zoe, honestly, I would say I didn't like it. The thing that changed it for me, was the people; they were so loving. So kind. They embraced me. **That changed my life.***

***I really needed someone to love me at that age."***

After completing school Nuan graduated from the ZOE Leadership Training Program. She holds a Bachelor of Arts with a Major in English.

Nuan is now the head of the ZOE Leadership training Program in Thailand and is happily married.

## Mama Obed Children's Home

Riots following the 2007 Kenyan national elections left 30,000 children orphaned overnight.

The Mama Obed Children's Home was founded in response; supporting 22 orphaned children, the program develops independence and helps children to access an education & develop life skills.

The team grow produce onsite and run a micro enterprise chicken farm to help create a sustainable income stream to support these children.

## SAMMY'S STORY

Sammy lives with his family in the Kenyan slum, Kibera and was born without arms.

With your support Mary Rice were able to identify and support Sammy and his siblings to access an education appropriate to their needs. Sammy and his siblings were in danger of being excluded from their schools as fees were in arrears at the end of 2019.

Sammy now attends boarding school at Joytown School for Children with a physical impairment. The school specialises in supporting children with physical impairments to engage in an education. However, the School is a long way from home so Sammy lives there and comes home during the holidays.

*"When I am there, I miss my mum and brother but we speak once a week on the phone when she can afford it. When I am home I miss my friends from school, the food and the swimming pool where I have therapy and games every day."*

During school holidays Sammy and his siblings are able to play with their friends at our Holiday Program; the care and supervision for the children means his mum can continue to seek an income to support her family.

Due to the covid-19 restrictions, schooling has been suspended in Kenya until 2021. As well as caring for her children during this pandemic, Sammy's mum is finding it harder and harder to find work cleaning clothes for people. During this pandemic we continue to support this family with food and basic supplies to help them survive.
